Economic instruments for managing environmentally harmful products in Ukraine: 3rd stakeholder workshop

The pilot project "Economic instruments for managing environmentally harmful products in Ukraine" is conducted in the framework of the "Greening Economies in the Eastern Neighbourhood" (EaP GREEN) programme which covers EU Eastern Partnership countries (Armenia, Azerbaijan, Belarus, Georgia, Moldova and Ukraine). EaP GREEN is funded primarily by the European Commission and is implemented by the OECD in partnership with the UNECE, UNEP and UNIDO.

The pilot project (2013-2015) aims at assisting Ukraine in the design and application of economic instruments that would facilitate the reduction of the environmental impacts of environmentally harmful products and, simultaneously, generate revenue for the public budget. The Policy Manual "Creating Market Incentives for Greener Products", developed based on best practices in OECD countries, provides a methodological basis for the work. In particular, the project focuses on product taxes and extended producer responsibility schemes.

The objective of this workshop is to present and discuss the draft pilot project report and its policy recommendations in the context of recent relevant policy developments in Ukraine.
